Oral Questions

- 43/2017 Hon. Semesa Karavaki to ask the Minister for Fisheries – Can the Minister explain why Ministerial officials are conducting consultation on the Qoliqoli and are referring to “Qoliqoli Owners” as “Vakatawa ni Qoliqoli”.
- 44/2017 Hon. Ro Kiniviliame Kiliraki to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister advise the House as to whether Sustainable Mahogany Industry (SMI) still has a Mahogany licence.
- 45/2017 Hon. Prem Singh to ask the Minister for Health and Medical Services – Would the Minister inform Parliament why the Colonial War Memorial Hospital, being the largest hospital in Fiji, ran out of chemicals to develop x-ray films.
- 46/2017 Hon. Viam Pillay to ask the Minister for Defence and National Security – Recent information and statistics maintained by the Fiji Police Force show fluctuations in overall crime cases. Can the Minister explain the recent trend in overall crime for the past three years.
- 47/2017 Hon. Jilila Kumar to ask the Minister for Health and Medical Services – Can the Minister inform this House on what were the actions of the Ministry in regards to Qamea Health Facility that was destroyed by the landslide during Tropical Depression 04F.
- 48/2017 Hon. Dr Brij Lal to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Rural and Maritime Development and National Disaster Management – Majority of our population consume rice at least once daily. What initiatives have been put in to strengthen rice growing to decrease our rice imports.
