## BILL NO. 35 OF 2016

# **A BILL**

### FOR AN ACT TO APPROPPRIATE A SUM OF THREE BILLION, THREE HUNDRED TWO MILLION, TWO HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND, AND SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY FIVE DOLLARS FOR THE ORDINARY SERVICES OF GOVERNMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING 31 JULY 2017

ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of Fiji-

Short title and commencement

**1.**—(1) This Act may be cited as the 2016–2017 Appropriation Act 2016.

(2) This Act comes into force on 1 August 2016.

#### Appropriation of \$3,302,212,765

**2.** A sum of \$3,302,212,765 is to be issued from the Consolidated Fund or other funds of the State, and applied to the ordinary services of the Government for the financial year ending 31 July 2017, and such sum is to be appropriated for the purposes specified in Schedules 1 and 2 and also the 2016–2017 Budget Estimates.

#### Government borrowing

**3.** The Government borrowing for 2016–2017 shall not exceed the sum of \$620,662,265.

### 2016–2017 APPROPRIATION BILL 2016

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Bill and is only intended to indicate its general effect)

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

1.1 This Bill makes provision for the estimates of capital and current expenditure for the ordinary services of the Government for the year 2016–2017.

#### 2.0 CLAUSES

- 2.1 Clause 1 provides for the short title and the commencement provisions.
- 2.2 Clause 2 appropriates the sum of \$3,302,212,765 for the ordinary services of the Government for the financial year ending 31 July 2017 for the purposes specified in Schedules 1 and 2 and the 2016–2017 Budget Estimates.
- 2.3 Clause 3 provides that the Government borrowing for 2016–2017 shall not exceed the sum of \$620,662,265.

### 3.0 MINISTERIAL RESPONSIBILITY

3.1 The Act comes under the responsibility of the Minister responsible for finance.
