Oral Questions

- 1/2018 Hon. Mosese Bilitavu to ask the Minister for Defence and National Security – Can the Minister inform this House on how effective the Duavata Initiative has been in reducing the national crime rate as a measure of collective security.
- 2/2018 Hon. Viliame Gavoka to ask the Prime Minister and Minister for i-Taukei Affairs, Sugar Industry and Foreign Affairs – Can the Prime Minister inform this House whether there is any intention on the part of the Government to establish a Truth and Reconciliation Commission to reconcile and unite the people of Fiji.
- 3/2018 Hon. Mikaele Leawere to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister inform this House on the progress of the reconstruction of schools destroyed by TC Winston.
- 4/2018 Hon. Ro Teimumu Kepa to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Would the Minister explain why the Fiji Bureau of Statistics cannot release data on ethnicity from the 2017 Fiji Population and Housing Census since the issues, for example on Health, Education and Social Welfare are impacted by ethnicity.
