9/2018 Hon. Jiosefa Dulakiverata to ask the Minister for Industry, Trade, Tourism, Lands and Mineral Resources

– Can the Minister advise this House on acres and sites of land developed by the State and the intended purpose of each site of land development.

With respect to Development of State Land it is one of the Ministry's core projects. The main objective of the project is to develop all vacant and/or under-utilised state land to their highest and best use and lease them out for productive use. The Ministry ensures that the project achieves the following results:

- To provide housing needs to the landless;
- To provide a secure investment and return;
- To improve delivery and quality of leasing services;
- To make efficient use of available land resources;
- To ensure proper usage of land;
- To reduce the land boundary disputes;
- To improve communication and administration mechanisms, particularly in relation to land;
- To house critical services in rural areas such Health Centres,
 Nursing Stations and other public facilities/services;
- To provide a long-term secured lease, which in turn will provide a form of security (mortgage etc.) for development; and;
- To have a fair return of revenue through rental.
