Oral Questions

- 186/2018 Hon. Ruveni Nadalo to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister brief the House on the assistance provided to sugar cane farmers after the recent flooding.
- 187/2018 Hon. Prem Singh to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Would the Minister inform Parliament whether or not Government intends to amend the Omnibus Electronic Fare Ticketing Act 2014 to remove the heavy fines imposed on bus drivers who allow passengers without e-tickets to board and travel on their bus.
- 188/2018 Hon. Ashneel Sudhakar to ask the Minister for Defence and National Security – Can the Minister inform the House on the role of the Fiji Hydrographic Unit.
- 189/2018 Hon. Ratu Naiqama Lalabalavu to ask the Minister for Youth and Sports – From the recent 2018 Commonwealth Games, Fiji won a lone Gold medal in the women’s weightlifting category (combined lift of 233kg). Can the Minister inform the House what sort of assistance is given to sporting organisations like weightlifting to help better Fiji’s participation at International tournaments.
- 190/2018 Hon. Netani Rika to ask the Minister for Employment, Productivity and Industrial Relations – Can the Minister inform the House on the actions taken to address complaints received from the Hotel and Catering Industry from 2015 – 2018.
- 191/2018 Hon. Mikaele Leawere to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister inform the House why the Teachers’ Terms 1 and 2 holidays are now reduced to one week instead of two weeks.
- 192/2018 Hon. Samuela Vunivalu to ask the Minister for Youth and Sports – Can the Minister highlight how the Ministry is creating learning pathways at the Youth Training Centres.

193/2018 Hon. Dr Mere Samisoni to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Public Enterprises, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister inform the House whether all 2,600 households located in rural areas within the four (4) divisions who applied for new solar home systems have all been catered for as budgeted in the 2017-2018 Budget Allocation.

How does the Ministry intend to provide an early resolution of OHS issues and complaints to reduce serious accidents and fatalities in the workplace.
