PARLIAMENT COMMITTEE MEETING LIVE SESSIONS A MILESTONE ACHIEVEMENT



Submission to the Standing Committee on Public Accounts from the Ministry of Economy

Parliament achieved another milestone by airing live the public submissions to the Standchannel on the Walesi platform and Parliament's website.

The first-ever live Committee sitting was during the submission by the Ministry of Economy to the Standing Committee on Public Accounts on the Report on Performance Audit of Preparedness for Implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (Parliamentary Paper No. 63 of 2019) on Monday, 3rd February, 2020.

According to the Chairperson and Assistant Minister for Employment, Productivity and Industrial Relations Hon. Alvick Maharaj, the Committee was fortunate to be the first to air live its public hearing.

"I am fortunate and glad to be given the opportunity to be here and be part of the first Committee of the Fijan Parliament to air live our public hearing since the launch of the system by the Honourable Speaker, His Excellency Ratu Epeli Najlatikau late last vear."

"It is a mark of an era for the Filian Parliament to introduce its Video Live Broadcasting System," Hon. Maharaj said.

SOCIAL DISTANCING DURING PARLIAMENT SITTINGS

It was an unusual Parliament sitting on Thursday, March 26, 2020 during the COVID-19 Response Budget announcement as some Members of Parliament were seated at the public gallery, due to the COVID-19 physical/social distancing measures.

Seating for Members of Parliament were rearranged during the COVID-19 Response Budget sitting in compliance with the COVID-19 physical/social distancing measures.

Speaker, His Excellency Hon. Ratu Epeli Nailatikau when convening the meeting, reemphasised the statement by the Hon. Prime Minister that Fiji is at war with the coronavirus,

"We cannot see our enemy but we must act as if the

enemy is in our midst at all times. In that regard, I am invoking my powers under Standing Order 20 to allow for the following:

(1) Alter the seating arrangement in Parliament so as to adhere to physical/social distancing of one to two metres and in doing so, you will note that some Members are seated in the public gallery; and

(2) The bar which demarcates the debating Chamber from the public gallery will remain open in all Parliament sittings for as long as COVID-19 remains a pandemic."

The Speaker added that the approval of finance and appropriations, whether it be an Annual Budget or a Supplementary Budget, is a fundamental role of any Leaislature.

For the Fijian Parliament, tertiary students within the greater Suva area were invited to tour Parliament to commemorate this special day, which is usually observed on the second Monday of March every year.

Students of the Fiji National University, University of the South Pacific (USP) and University of Fiji turned up in numbers and were taken through a tour of Parliament, given a short presentation about Parliament, met with some Members of Parliament and also participated in Quizzes.

For Solomon Islands final year USP student, Sally Kura, the visit has broadened her knowledge about the Commonwealth and also the Fijian Parliament.

"Back at home, I have never visited our Parliament and it's a privilege to visit this august House in Fiji.

While visiting the Chamber, I noticed that Members of Parliament sit close to each other across the room, as compared to what I see on television."

University of the South Pacific student Sanjeshni Prasad was full of praise of her visit to Parliament and said that all the departments within Parliament was explained very well.

"We participated in lots of quizzes which helped us to better understand Parliament and the Commonwealth. I learnt how countries are grouped together within the Commonwealth and how they assist each other financially, especially during natural disasters." For University of Fiji law student, Viliame Koroinivalu, the visit has helped him to learn more about the history of the Fijian Parliament and getting to meet some Members of Parliament.
