Oral Questions

- 1/2021 Hon. Lenora Qereqeretabua to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister update Parliament on the contingency measures taken by Fiji Airways as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic on the air travel industry.
- 2/2021 Hon. Alexander O'Connor to ask the Minister for Commerce, Trade, Tourism and Transport – Can the Minister explain what assistance is available for MSMEs in Fiji, especially in light of the COVID-19 pandemic and Tropical Cyclone Yasa and Tropical Cyclone Ana.
- 3/2021 Hon. Ratu Naiqama Lalabalavu to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister provide an update to Parliament on the arrangement of the \$1 billion loan from the World Bank and the International Finance Corporation under the Country Partnership Agreement 2020-2024.
