### **Oral Questions**

- 20/2021 Hon. Pio Tikoduadua to ask the Minister for Health and Medical Services – Can the Minister inform Parliament what action will be taken against residents building chicken coops next to dwelling

homes for chicks provided by the Ministry of Agriculture in the rural non-municipal town like Korovou, which is in contravention of rural local authority or health by-laws.

- 21/2021 Hon. Alexander O'Connor to ask the Minister for Commerce, Trade, Tourism and Transport – Given that price gouging is a market occurrence during times of disasters and crises, can the Minister inform Parliament on the prevalence of the issue of price gouging pre and post Tropical Cyclone Yasa and Tropical Cyclone Ana and the steps that were undertaken to minimise it.
- 22/2021 Hon. Mikaele Leawere to ask the Attorney-General and Minister for Economy, Civil Service and Communications – Can the Minister inform Parliament of Government's plans with respect to the 60,000 Fiji National Provident Fund members with zero balance in their accounts.
- 23/2021 Hon. George Vegnathan to ask the Minister for Infrastructure, Meteorological Services, Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the status of reinstating water supply to affected areas during the course of Tropical Cyclone Yasa and Tropical Cyclone Ana.
- 24/2021 Hon. Ro Teimumu Kepa to ask the Minister for Education, Heritage and Arts – Can the Minister inform Parliament what plans are in place for online learning platforms and other emergency teaching procedures for students in the event of natural disasters or another COVID-19 lockdown.
- 25/2021 Hon. Viam Pillay to ask the Minister for Education, Heritage and Arts – Can the Minister inform Parliament, what counselling support will be provided to the teachers and students affected by Tropical Cyclone Yasa and Tropical Cyclone Ana.
- 26/2021 Hon. Jese Saukuru to ask the Minister for Defence, National Security and Policing, Rural and Maritime Development and Disaster Management – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the role of NDMO in raising awareness and educating our people on how to prepare for natural disasters.
