MINUTES

of Proceedings of Parliament at Suva on Thursday, Twenty-fifth Day of March, 2021

- 1. The House met at 9.30 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

3. <u>MEMBERS PRESENT</u>

All Honourable Members were present except for the Hon. Aiyaz Sayed-Khaiyum, Hon. Osea Naiqamu and Hon. Ratu Naiqama Lalabalavu.

4. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

(a) <u>Standing Committee on Public Accounts</u>
