- (a) to amend the Parliamentary approval dated 25 May 2020 for the FJ\$455 million Government guarantee to Air Pacific Limited trading as Fiji Airways ('Fiji Airways') to read as follows 'Parliament approves that the Government of the Republic of Fiji guarantee Fiji Airways borrowings consisting of a mix of domestic borrowings up to FJ\$191.1 million and offshore borrowings up to US\$117.1 million with a total limit of approximately FJ\$455 million valid until the guaranteed facilities are discharged by the lender or fully settled'; and
- (b) that Fiji Airways pay a one off fee of 15% on the FJ\$455 million government guarantee."
