SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

Oral Questions

- 229/2021 Hon. Pio Tikoduadua to ask the Minister for Health and Medical Services – Can the Minister update Parliament whether the Ministry has considered the impact of Long COVID on COVID-19 survivors.
- 230/2021 Hon. Vijay Nath to ask the Minister for Commerce, Trade, Tourism and Transport – Can the Minister update Parliament how the Integrated Human Resources Development Programme (IHRDP) will contribute to rural livelihoods in the 2021-2022 financial year.
- 231/2021 Hon. Peceli Vosanibola to ask the Minister for Infrastructure, Meteorological Services, Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister update Parliament on the reconstruction of the damaged Levuka Wharf.
- 232/2021 Hon. Veena Bhatnagar to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Waterways and Environment – Can the Minister update Parliament on the progress made with regards to the Ministry's 50/50 Village Nutritional Security programme.
- 233/2021 Hon. Ro Filipe Tuisawau to ask the Minister for Defence, National Security and Policing, Rural and Maritime Development and Disaster Management – Can the Minister update Parliament on Fiji's participation in peacekeeping programmes since 2018.

Written Questions

- 237/2021 Hon. Lenora Qereqeretabua to ask the Prime Minister and Minister for iTaukei Affairs, Sugar Industry, Foreign Affairs and Forestry – There are reforestation efforts by villages in Tovulailai, Natauloa, Lawaki, Vutuna and Waitoga in Narai, Lomaiviti. There were 52,579 seedlings and each village had a target of about 10,000 seedlings to raise for reforestation. Can the Prime Minister update Parliament on –
- (a) the output of the cash incentives granted to Fijians who grow seedlings to be transplanted for planting under the ‘Reforestation of Degraded Forests (RDF) Project’; and
 - (b) how many villages have received a payout, and how much have they received, to raise these seedlings.

Jese Saukuru to ask the Minister for Infrastructure, Meteorological Services, Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister update Parliament on the parcels of land under Schedule A and Schedule B that were reverted to the TLTB by the Ministry in the 2020-2021 financial year, in particular –
- (a) the name, location and description of all such parcels of land; and
 - (b) the name of the extinct Tokatoka, Mataqali or Yavusa whose land has been reverted and the corresponding details of the Tokatoka, Mataqali or Yavusa to whom these parcels of land are being reverted.
- 239/2021 Hon. Anare Jale to ask the Minister for Infrastructure, Meteorological Services, Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister update Parliament on –
- (a) how many citizens and households in rural and maritime communities now have access to clean water by Division annually from 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021; and
 - (b) how many citizens and households in rural and maritime communities will be able to access clean water by the end of the 2021-2022 financial year.
