# LEVUKA TOWN COUNCIL

Prior to Cession there was no actual Local Government Authority formed to control the affairs of Levuka and the residents themselves had little or no say in the management of the town. This was a period when the town was being planned by the British engineers and this included the construction of roads, seawall, etc.

Three years after Cession the Town Ordinance of 1877 was passed giving residents of Levuka the right to govern the town. A Council was appointed with the first Warden of Levuka, the Hon. J.G. Smith. Various Wardens were appointed during the following years up till 1900. In the same year another ordinance was passed enabling the residents of Levuka to elect their own Councillors and Mayor. The first Mayor was Cr. D.J. Solomon, a well known member in those days.

It is important to note some events that led to a gradual decline in Levuka were: -

- The shift of the capital from Levuka to Suva in 1881 which led to a decline in the export trade.
- The hounding of German businesses during World War.
- The economic depression of the mid 1930's as already mentioned.
- The final blow was in the loss of the copra trade.

In 1935 the previous ordinance was rescinded and replaced by the township ordinance of the same year. The reason was due to the depressed state of the economy of Fiji in the mid 1930's. It was during this period that Government took over the reigns and appointed a Township Board under the leadership of a chairman who was the Commissioner Eastern. The government also gave a small grant to help the Board to function. As the economy improved the grant was decreased and was later withdrawn.

After independence the Local Government Act 4 of 1972 was passed giving all townships in Fiji municipality status and the power to elect their own Town Council and Councillors and its Mayor.

Government negotiations resulted in the establishment of the Pacific Fishing Company. Today the factory is the backbone of Levuka's economy. Since coming into partnership with Bumble Bee, an American Company, Pafco continues to go from strength to strength thus assuring Levuka of a bright future. The little town of Levuka has also been inscribed into the UNESCO World Heritage Listing. This was unique bringing out the old charm and preserving that familiar look that Levuka is famous for Levuka is the birthplace of a nation.

Through team work initiative and a dedication to excellence the Levuka Town Council will endeavour to facilitate employment opportunities and to provide a good environment, adequate infrastructure and high levels of customer service ensuring a quality lifestyle for the people of Levuka.



#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

#### Scope

I have audited the financial statements of the Levuka Town Council for the year ended 31 December 2006 in accordance with Section 57(2) of the Local Government Act and Section 13 of the Audit Act. The Levuka Town Council is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain.

I have conducted an independent audit of these financial statements in order to express an opinion on them.

My audit was conducted in accordance with the Fiji Standards on Auditing to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatements. My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements and the evaluation of accounting policies. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Fiji Accounting Standards and statutory requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Council's financial position, the results of its operations, and its cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

#### Qualifications

- The Statement of Revenue and Expenditure of the Council at 31 December 2006 has been prepared using the cash basis of accounting and does not take into account revenues not received and expenditures not paid at balance date. Similarly, the Statement of Financial Position does not incorporate debtors, prepayments, creditors and accruals and is therefore a limited statement of financial position. This basis of accounting is not in accordance with Section 57(1) of the Local Government Act.
- Records to substantiate the bank balance for Sanitation Account (\$9) and Back to Levuka Account (\$438) were not made available during the audit.
- The Vat Payable amount of \$10,684 could not be substantiated as the Vat Returns for the year ended 31 December 2006 were not produced during the audit.

#### **Qualified Audit Opinion**

In my opinion, because of the effects of the matters discussed in the qualification paragraph, the financial statements do not present fairly the financial position of the Levuka Town Council as at 31 December 2006 and the result of its operations for the year then ended.

#### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Council is set out in this note. The policies adopted are in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in Fiji, and unless stated otherwise are consistent with those applied in the prior year.

(a) The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, which contemplates the continuity of business activities and the realisation of assets and the payment of liabilities in the normal course of business. At 31 December 2006 the council's overall excess of liabilities over assets (deficiency) was \$11,891. (2005: \$25,149)

#### (b) Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on cash basis.

(c) The Council has adopted the policy of charging to income the full cost of the assets at the time of acquisition, except projects financed from Loan Funds which are capitalised as expenditure is incurred and are written down in value by the actual amount of principal repaid annually over the period of the loans.

#### (d) Arrears of Revenue

As the accounts are kept on a cash basis the arrears of rates and interest, garbage fees and the other revenue at the end of the year not reflected in the financial statements were:

#### NOTE 3: TERM LOAN

The Council took an initial loan of \$61,000 in 1991 bearing an interest of 11 percent per annum. The Loan term was for 15 years with a monthly repayment of \$800. The loan raised is under the provisions of the Local Government Act and is secured against the assets of the Council.
