FOREWARD

The Levuka Town Council has come through a historical transformation since first proclaimed a township in 1877. Levuka has a long history as one of the best remaining examples of a town or settlement reflective of the European exploitation and colonization in the South Pacific. It remains a unique town in that it has managed to retain a high degree of authenticity and a wealth of old buildings.

The development of Levuka as a township is a formidable challenge because its ratepayers alone cannot justify its viability. Every year we have placed on record one of the many pressing needs of the Council is funding. With only 152 ratepayers, the rates and other business revenue is limited. LEVUKA TOWN COUNCIL

Prior to Cession there was no actual Local Government Authority formed to control the affairs of Levuka and the residents themselves had little or no say in the management of the town. This was a period when the town was being planned by the British engineers and this included the construction of roads, seawall, etc.

Three years after Cession the Town Ordinance of 1877 was passed giving residents of Levuka the right to govern the town. A Council was appointed with the first Warden of Levuka, the Hon. J.G. Smith. Various Wardens were appointed during the following years up till 1900. In the same year another ordinance was passed enabling the residents of Levuka to elect their own Councillors and Mayor. The first Mayor was Cr. D.J. Solomon, a well known member in those days.

It is important to note some events that led to a gradual decline in Levuka were: -

- The shift of the capital from Levuka to Suva in 1881 which led to a decline in the export trade.
- The hounding of German businesses during World War.
- The economic depression of the mid 1930's as already mentioned.
- The final blow was in the loss of the copra trade.

In 1935 the previous ordinance was rescinded and replaced by the township ordinance of the same year. The reason was due to the depressed state of the economy of Fiji in the mid 1930's. It was during this period that Government took over the reigns and appointed a Township Board under the leadership of a chairman who was the Commissioner Eastern. The government also gave a small grant to help the Board to function. As the economy improved the grant was decreased and was later withdrawn.

After independence the Local Government Act 4 of 1972 was passed giving all townships in Fiji municipality status and the power to elect their own Town Council and Councillors and its Mayor.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Scope

I have audited the financial statements of the Levuka Town Council for the year ended 31 December 2007 in accordance with section 57(2) of the Local Government Act and section 13 of the Audit Act. The Levuka Town Council is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information they contain.

I have conducted an independent audit of these financial statements in order to express an opinion on them.

My audit was conducted in accordance with the Fiji Standards on Auditing to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatements. My audit procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Fiji Accounting Standards and statutory requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Council's financial position, the results of its operations and its cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualifications

- The Statement of Revenue and Expenditure of the Council as at 31 December 2007 has been
 prepared using the cash basis of accounting and does not take into account revenues not
 received and expenditures not paid at balance date. Similarly, the Statement of Financial
 Position does not incorporate debtors, prepayments, creditors and accruals and is therefore a
 limited statement of financial position. This basis of accounting is not in accordance with
 Section 57(1) of the Local Government Act.
- The bank reconciliation prepared by the Council for the year was incomplete. The Council only prepared cash summaries and failed to reconcile it with the Bank records.
- The Vat Receivable amount of \$18,778 could not be substantiated as documents and records pertaining to this amount were not made available during audit.

Qualified Audit Opinion

In my opinion, because of the effects of the matters discussed in the qualification paragraph, the financial statements do not present fairly the financial position of the Levuka Town Council as at 31 December 2007 and the result of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Council is set out in this note. The policies adopted are in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in Fiji, and unless stated otherwise are consistent with those applied in the prior year.

- a) The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, which contemplates the continuity of business activities and the realisation of assets and the payment of liabilities in the normal course of business. At 31 December 2007 the Council's overall excess of assets over liabilities (surplus) was \$26,616 (2006: (\$11,891)).
- b) The financial statements have been prepared on cash basis.
- c) The Council has adopted the policy of charging to income the full cost of the assets at the time of acquisition, except projects financed from Loan Funds which are capitalised as expenditure is incurred and are written down in value by the actual amount of principal repaid annually over the period of the loans.

d) Arrears of Revenue

As the accounts are kept on a cash basis the arrears of rates and interest, garbage fees and the other revenue at the end of the year, not reflected in the financial statements were:
