



Budget 2018–2019 Head No. 2: Office of the Prime Minister

Background

The Office of the Prime Minister ('OPM') provides administrative and logistical support to the Prime Minister in his role as Head of Government and Chairperson of Cabinet. The OPM also has authority over the Department of Immigration, which is responsible for passport issuance, entry and departure permits, and processing of citizenship applications.

The 2018–2019 Budget sees a slight increase in operating expenditure, and a larger increase in capital expenditure funding (under both this head and *Head 50 – Miscellaneous Services*) compared to 2017–2018.

Trends

The OPM allocation for 2018–2019 totals **\$24.1 million**, comprising **\$14.3 million** for operating expenditure and **\$9.3 million** for capital expenditure. The total allocation represents an increase of 0.5 per cent on the last financial year (**\$24.0 million**).

An additional **\$8.2 million** has been allocated for capital expenditure under *Head 50 – Miscellaneous Services*.

The following graphs show funding trends over the past five years.

Budget announcements and allocations

Citizenship and immigration

The Budget allocates **\$50,000** of new funding to citizenship ceremonies. It also provides **\$300,000** to improve access to immigration services and install new systems for passport issuance.

Raising living standards

The Budget allocates **\$9.0 million** to the Prime Minister's Small Grants Scheme (the same as the 2017-2018 Budget), which does the following:

- Education: Upgrades to school buildings, sports grounds and footpaths. The allocation also covers the installation of solar and water systems, and funds the purchase of school furniture, equipment and technology.
- **Community Development:** Among other things, this scheme upgrades and constructs evacuation centres, procures sports equipment for youth groups, funds women's empowerment programs, and constructs infrastructure projects.

Mahogany industry development

The Budget allocates **\$250,000** to support the development of the mahogany industry and the activities of the Fiji Mahogany Trust.

Maintenance of facilities

\$8.0 million will be provided in 2018-2019 to continue work on a new Prime Minister's Office Complex, and **\$158,000** allocated to continue maintenance works on the Prime Minister's Official Residence. This funding is provided under *Head 50 – Miscellaneous Services*.
