## SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

### Oral Questions

- 29/2019 Hon. Prof. Biman Prasad to ask the Prime Minister and Minister for iTaukei Affairs and Sugar Industry – Would the Prime Minister inform Parliament whether an investigation, that was announced by the Sugar Permanent Secretary, was conducted on the former Chief Executive of the Fiji Sugar Corporation.
- 30/2019 Hon. Vijendra Prakash to ask the Minister for Employment, Productivity, Industrial Relations, Youth and Sports – Can the Minister explain the role of the National OHS Service in the issuance of business license.
- 31/2019 Hon. Aseri Radrodro to ask the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Disaster Management and Meteorological Services – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the Government’s plans to ensure public safety from the threats of landslides at vulnerable spots occurring along our roads.
- 32/2019 Hon. Sanjay Kirpal to ask the Minister for Industry, Trade, Tourism, Local Government, Housing and Community Development – Can the Minister inform Parliament on what the Ministry has done with regards to the 2016 Amended Investment Act and Policy.

- (i) Government provide a guarantee of \$160 million for the repayment of the short and long-term bonds, promissory notes, term deposits, and other short-term borrowings of the Fiji Development Bank for the 12-month period from 1 March 2019 to 29 February 2020; and
- (ii) the Fiji Development Bank pay a guarantee fee of 0.075% on the utilised credit.”
