

PARLIAMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF FIJI

MINUTES

of Proceedings of Parliament at Suva on Thursday, Thirtieth day of March, 2023

- 1. The House met at 9.30 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.
- 2. Hon. Speaker took the Chair and read the Prayer.

3. MEMBERS PRESENT

All Honourable Members were present except for the Hon. Sanjay Kirpal.

4. <u>CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES</u>

The Leader of the Government in Parliament the Hon. Lynda Tabuya moved that the Minutes of the sitting of Parliament held on Wednesday, 29 March 2023 as previously circulated, be taken as read and be confirmed.

Motion seconded.

Question put.

Motion agreed to unanimously.

5. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CHAIR

Hon. Speaker welcomed all Honourable Members to the sitting of Parliament. He also welcomed the LLB students from the Fiji National University and those in the gallery and all those watching the live broadcast and the live-streaming of the proceedings.

He informed all Honourable Members that Hon. Jovesa Vocea, Hon. Alvick Maharaj and Hon. Hem Chand were now also Members of the Global Organisation of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC).

6. PRESENTATION OF REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Standing Committee on Social Affairs

(a) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Social Affairs the Hon. Alitia Bainivalu tabled the annual review of the Land Transport Authority annual reports from 2014 to 2017.

Oral Questions

21/2023 Hon. Shalen Kumar asked the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance and Strategic Planning, National Development and Statistics – Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament whether TSLS Board will continue to receive application for Toppers and TELS and issue scholarships.

22/2023 Hon. Jovesa Vocea asked the Minister for iTaukei Affairs and Culture, Heritage and Arts – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Ministry's plans to ensure vacant chiefly titles are filled promptly.

23/2023 Hon. Naisa Tuinaceva to ask the Minister for Agriculture and Waterways – With the closure of the green ginger market, can the Minister inform Parliament whether the Ministry can assist farmers with unsold and unharvested ginger.


- 24/2023 Hon. Lenora Qereqeretabua to ask the Minister for Education Can the Minister inform Parliament if TVET is the answer to skill shortage in Fiji and abroad, and what is the current direction of the Ministry in regards to the TVET programme.
- 25/2023 Hon. Ratu Josaia Niudamu asked the Minister for Public Works and Meteorological Services, and Transport Can the Minister inform Parliament what system does the Ministry intend to utilise that will be more transparent than the existing taxi permit lottery system.
- 26/2023 Hon. Ratu Isikeli Tuiwailevu asked the Deputy Prime Minister and the Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on the Domestic Air Services Subsidy Scheme.
- 27/2023 Hon. Penioni Ravunawa asked the Minister for Health and Medical Services Can the Minister inform Parliament if Fiji is really out of the woods in terms of combating COVID-19.
- 28/2023 Hon. Esrom Emanuel to ask the Minister for Women, Children and Poverty Alleviation Can the Minister update Parliament on the meeting of the UN Commission on the Status of Women held earlier this month.
