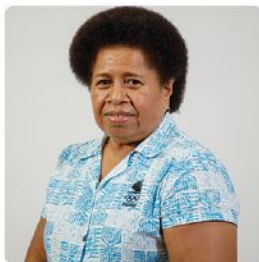

I take this opportunity to sincerely thank Lorraine Mar, who has served FASANOC for over three decades. She has led the staff through one of the most challenging times in the history with her passion and commitment to FASANOC's vision as she stepped down from the CEO role after twelve years.

Furthermore, I would like to thank my board member colleagues for their support, experience and leadership. Their guidance, knowledge and skills throughout the year especially during the recruitment process for the CEO role and working alongside them has been a great honour for me. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Following on from the COVID 19 challenges of 2021 and the highlight of the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games, 2022 was another very busy year for FASANOC and no less challenging with the pandemic still impacting on sports activities.

We were very pleased to welcome HE Ratu Wiliame Katonivere as the new Patron of FASANOC and appreciated his support for Team Fiji throughout the year. His Excellency also boosted the morale of Team Fiji when he attended the Opening Ceremony for the Birmingham Commonwealth Games.

Attending two Games in a year is always a challenge. Not just for FASANOC but also for the National Federations. Lack of Government funding for the Pacific Mini Games meant that FASANOC had to stretch its limited funding between preparation and participation which compromised Games time performance.

Although the Team came away with 9 Gold, 16 Silver and 19 Bronze medals, Team Fiji's overall placing of 7th on the medal tally indicates a lot of hard work will need to be done if Team Fiji is targeting a top 3 finish at the 2023 Solomon Islands Pacific Games. Team Fiji did well

to win 2 Silver and 2 Bronze medals at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games although the Men's 7s Gold medal remained elusive! FASANOC Commissions continued to be active during the year and their time and contributions, all voluntary, are gratefully acknowledged. With Team Fiji attending two Games, the Selection Justification Commission dedicated many hours in meetings to interview team officials and vet final team selection. The Medical Commission volunteers also worked closely with Team Fiji. We are especially proud of our Athletes Commission and the Athletes and Communities Engagement Program (ACE) for their dedication to empowering our athletes on their pathway to sports leadership. Our Athlete Champions demonstrate what a great enabler sport is towards capacity building and community engagement.

A lot of work and consultations were carried out during the year towards creating the new edition of FASANOC's Strategic Plan for presentation to the membership in the new year.

In the meantime, the following reports reflect the pillars of the current Strategic Plan of FASANOC.

Activities held during the Year:

The Programme successfully completed another year of outreach/awareness and education on key social issues faced in Fiji aligning to the Olympic Agenda 2020 + 5, ONOC VOA message priorities, FASANOC Strategic Plan Pillar 2 for Commission and Sports Services as well as the FASANOC Vision to inspire the people of Fiji through sports excellence on the road to recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

The outreach/awareness and education sessions focused on being good role models by making the right choices that are good for all as individuals, the community, and the upcoming generation. The programme reached out to various target groups from primary school, high school, youths, adults and elderly on various sports, special events and community outreaches. With Athlete Champions aspiring to inspire individuals they reached out to within the programme.

Highlight was the engagement of FASANOC ACE Programme Coordinator Jeegar Bhavsar and Athlete Champion Matelita Vuakoso as lead and coordinators of the VOA Regional activities with ONOC at the 2022 Pacific Mini Games in Saipan. Eugene Vollmer was also selected as a champion to advocate at the Games with other regional champions.

Coca-Cola Secondary Schools Games 18-20 August HFC Stadium, Suva	Organized with Fiji Secondary School Athletics Association. Main outcome: Creating a Multisectoral strategy that will fight NCDs in Fiji. <i>Participants: Athletes from 26 schools</i>
Regional VOA Outreach coordinated by ONOC, 15-26 June Saipan, Northern Marianas	ACE Team represented at the Pacific Games along with Athlete Champions from other Pacific Islands to advocate and educate participating athletes and athlete support personnel on the key messages of Stay Healthy, Clean Sport, Safeguarding, Go Green, Be A Leader in partnership with Australian Anti-Doping Association and Oceania Regional Anti-Doping Organisation.
Wainibuka Community Outreach/Awareness Session, 24-28 August, Nalidi Village, Wainibuka	In partnership with the Ministry of Health (MOH) Tailevu Subdivision. One on one and group discussions were held between community members and the outreach team, to spark awareness and encourage dialogue on the 5 key ACE messages, emphasizing the importance of talking about issues that affect health and well-being, without fear of recrimination, ridicule and judgment. The ACE outreach endeavours to provide a safe space through sport for such discussions to take place. <i>Participants: Males 170, Females 130, Total: 300</i>
Inter - District Championship (IDC) Super Premier Women's Football Tournament 18-20, November Ratu Cakobau Park, Nausori	Education Outreach conducted in partnership with Fiji Football Association. Emphasis on health and leadership, reinforced the practical value of engaging in sports, to help reduce and prevent NCDs. All participants were inspired to be leaders on and off the sports arena. <i>Participants: Females 105 & 8 Males = Total : 113</i>
Western Sports Outreach, 27-29 November: Fiji Men's U16 National FFA McDonalds Junior League Competition, Ba Football Academy Pacific Community Cup 2022, Prince Charles Park, Nadi	In collaboration with Fiji Football Association sessions on Awareness, Education and Evaluation on the athletes understanding of the VOA messages and the Play True pledge. Being flexible, also meant the ACE team could take advantage of the opportunity to reach athletes and officials in the other sports events that took place at the same time as the FA Pacific Community Cup tournament. Six teams competed in this competition. Each team had 15 Junior athletes per team, and 4 female footballers per team. <i>Participants: Males 66, Females 24 = Total: 90</i> Fiji FA President Mr Rajesh Patel explained the special significance of hosting a tournament that brings our people back together after the two year break caused by the Covid-19 pandemic. He said, Fiji FA was donating all the funds raised from the gate-taking to the WOW Kids Fiji, as part of Fiji FA's corporate responsibility. WOW Kids is a charitable foundation that helps care for children diagnosed with cancer. ACE had outreach presentations to the visiting All Star athletes. <i>Participants: Males 176 = Total: 176</i>
Barracuda Swimming Club (BSC), Nadi Sports Club	ACE outreach with the Barracuda Swimming Club in Nadi, led by ACE Champion and Olympian swimmer Cheyenne Rova. The key topics were Stay Healthy & Go Green, delivered to participants who were predominantly minors.

Wainibuka Community Outreach Awareness Session, Delasui Village, Tailevu 05 December	In partnership with the Ministry of Health (MOH) Tailevu Subdivision. The ACE outreach to Delasui Village, capitalized on the opportunity to promote sports as a platform for a healthy productive lifestyle. It served to reinforce and support the Naiyavu medical team's ongoing work and professional efforts to control and reduce the high cases of NCDs. <i>Participants: Males 93, Females 89, Total: 182</i>
Namosi Community Outreach/Awareness Session, Navunikabi Catholic School 13 December	Cheyenne Rova, an ACE Champion, Olympian and qualified teacher, organized this outreach by sourcing outreach funds and getting the required permission from village elders to conduct the outreach on her visit to Navunikabi Catholic School in Namosi. Her on-site account and pictures reflect an enjoyable and fruitful outcome. Promoting the ACE messages should be a mutually rewarding and enjoyable experience for both participants and ACE Champions. <i>Participants: Years 4-7 Students Total: 58 Students</i>
Oceania Triathlon Pacific Islands Championship, Vuda Boating Marina, Nadi 17-18 December	The ACE Team successfully achieved its target to reach and deliver the VOA messages to all athletes competing in the Championship. Participants also included medical support personnel and family members of athletes and officials. Special emphasis was given to the 'Play True' message, focusing on anti-doping, and designed to target and help participants, who were attending their first IF sanctioned competition. <i>Participants: Males 21, Females 13, Total 34 from 7 Pacific countries, including 6 coaches plus an additional 30 family, friends and Officials</i>
Sports Matters Fun Day Outreach, Nausori Village, 20 December	In partnership with Sports Matters, the event provided a platform for people with disabilities, focusing on amputees, to try a new sport in a safe and inclusive environment. Some of the participants came out of their homes and comfort zones for the first time since their amputation, to attend the Fun Day event. Activities included Archery, Sitting Badminton, Table Tennis, Sitting Volleyball, and Lawn Bowls held at the Suva Bowling Club coordinated by National Federations. <i>Participants: Males 29, Females 36, Total: 65</i>

DRUG FREE SPORT FIJI

Activities/Programs/Courses held:

Appointment of Ana Tuiketeki as Member of WADA Independent Ethics Board

Prominent international lawyer and arbitrator, Ms. Ana Tuiketeki was nominated to become the latest member of the World Anti-Doping Organization (WADA) Independent Ethics Board after her nomination was considered successful by the WADA Nomination Committee and Foundation Board at their meeting on 19 May 2022, in Cairo, Egypt. We congratulate Ms. Tuiketeki, a Fiji citizen, on her successful appointment.

Continental Results Management Panel (CRMP) for Asia/Oceania:

Nicholas Barnes, Chair of Fiji National Anti-Doping Organization (NADO), selected as a member of the CRMP for Asia/Oceania; term commenced on 01 June 2022. The two-year and four-month term will see Mr. Barnes in the hearing panel to arbitrate matters pursuant to the Anti-Doping Organizations anti-doping rules. The CRMP processes are aligned to the 2021 World Anti-Doping Code and the International Standard for Results Management. Mr. Barnes will join various members from Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Maldives, Pakistan, Singapore and Turkmenistan. The ORADO is proud to recognize this appointment, and the opportunities this presents for Oceania.

Testing:

Drug Free Sport Fiji conducted testing, both in and out of competition with various sporting codes. The cost of these tests was funded through the World Anti-Doping Agency Testing Grant 2022 and User Pay Clients of ORADO.

World Anti-Doping Code Signatory Tier:

In line with the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA's) International Standard for Code Compliance by Signatories (ISCCS), Fiji is now a Tier 2 country based on their achievements at the last Olympic Games, Tokyo 2020.

Now that Fiji has become a Tier 2 status, they will no longer have access to the WADA Testing Grant 2023, which may now require support from Government to assist with the cost of Testing.

Code Compliance Questionnaire (CCQ):

The Code Compliance Questionnaire is a tool developed by WADA to measure compliance of NADOs to the mandatory requirements of the Code and International Standards. The questionnaire is categorized into six sections, namely

1. General;
2. Testing and Investigations;
3. Results Management;
4. Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE);
5. Education; and
6. Privacy.

Thanks to Drug Free Sport New Zealand, we were able to secure funds to get a person to assist with the work-load to help fill out this compliance obligation and get it submitted by the due date. We are now in the process of completing the Critical areas of the CCQ. ORADO Doping Control Program Manager, also assisted the NADO with this questionnaire.

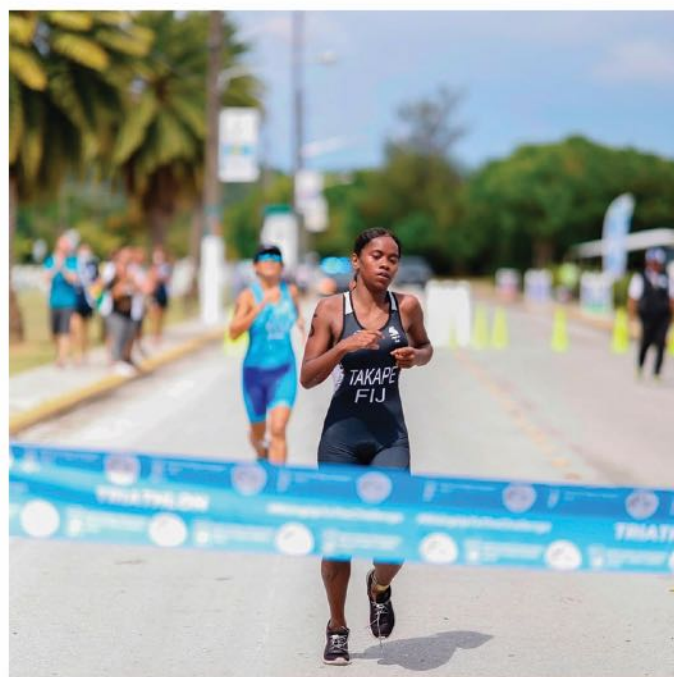

1.2 TEAM PREPARATION

Team preparation was severely affected for the Games as there had not been a budget allocation from Government for Team Fiji. However, Team Fiji is very thankful to Olympic Solidarity for funding via the Continental Athlete Support Grant and the National Activities Program coordinated by ONOC. Funding assisted sports with their preparation expenses that included payments for training venues, transportation to and from training, hosting of trials and competition and training camps. Athletics were also fortunate to have Banuve Tabakauoro and Yeshnil Karan attend overseas training camps.

1.3 ON-LINE ACCREDITATION

Database entries began in earnest in December 2021 with the gathering of information for each individual athlete and official so that each could be adequately accredited for participation in the Games. Online Accreditation system closed on Tuesday 03 May.

1.4 SELECTION JUSTIFICATION COMMITTEE (SJC)

SJC conducted Team Officials Interviews in November 2021, with final team names approved and publicised in April, 2022. There were a few Appeals received and heard by the FASANOC Appeals Tribunal.

The preparation phase for Team Fiji administration continued on a momentum and included Accreditation, Accommodation, Travel, Uniforms as well as keeping abreast of the regular updates with the Organizing Committee's requirements and ensuring they were met and accomplished in a timely manner.

1:2 ADMINISTRATION

This year's Commonwealth Games was different with all information laid out on a digital platform – the Brum Exchange CGA Portal, that detailed the full range of services and facilities available to all CGAs during the Games. Sports could access information relating to all

areas of their sport at the Games and share with athletes. Information included travel, venue, competition schedules, competition manuals, key dates, technical meetings, sporting manuals etc.

1:3 ONLINE ACCREDITATION

The online accreditation portal opened in November for all athletes and officials and closed in March 2022. Accreditation was based on the long list submitted by the NFs plus the entourage of Government, Guests, FASANOC President and Secretary General, High Commission personnel in London, Headquarters Team that included the Medical Team.

1:4 UK VISAS/AUSTRALIAN TRANSIT VISAS

The majority of team members required UK visas that were identified through the accreditation portal. Team Fiji's travel was through Australia with transit times exceeding the 8 hours and therefore everyone had to apply for Australian transit visas. Three sports (Athletics, Table Tennis and Triathlon) needed full visas as they spent time in Australia for Pre-Games Training Camps.

1:5 LEVIES

A levy was required to be paid by respective NFs which assisted towards participation expenses of travel, insurance, visas, transit expenses, transport and uniform items. Levies were payable in two instalments by 30 April and 30 June, 2022.

1:6 TRAVEL & TEAM PREPARATION

The B2022 Commonwealth Games Organising Committee provided a travel grant towards the cost of international flights based on the most direct economy fare to Birmingham with standard baggage allowance of 23kg. Fares were to be finalised by 29 June in line with the Entry by Name deadline.

Not all sports travelled directly from Fiji to the UK as the following had travelled to pre Games training camps:

Boxing – Jone Davule and Elia Rokobuli travelled to New Zealand on 26th June for a 3-week training camp with coach Cameron Todd. They left for the UK on 14th July for a 2-week training camp in Sheffield, Manchester.

Rugby 7s Men – The full squad departed for Pre-Games training camp on 9th July in Dorset, UK with lone athlete Isireli Maqala joining the team from France on 19th July.

Swimming – Two swimmers travelled to Budapest on 16th June with Section Manager Lucy Erasito to participate in the FINA Long Course World Championships and then flew to London on 27th June to join the rest of their team for Pre-Games training in London.

Para Athletics and Table Tennis – Following the successful GAPS (Gather, Adjust, Prepare and Sustain) camps held in April and May, 2022 in Australia, Para athletes Naibili Vatunisolo (Athletics) and Akanisi Latu

(Table Tennis) were invited to attend the Pre-Games Staging Camp in Birmingham from 18–23 July and travelled with coaches Fred Fatiaki and Harvi Yee.

Table Tennis and Triathlon – Athletes attended training camps in preparation for the Games in Australia funded by the Pacific Partnerships Program. They then joined the flight with the rest of Team Fiji on 21st July in Sydney.

Athletics – Banuve Tabakucoro did a round-the-world trip starting from Australia where he attended the GAPS programme and competed in the Oceania Championships held in Mackay, Australia. He then departed for the United States on 13th July to compete in the World Championships in Oregon before joining Team Fiji in Birmingham.

Judo – Gerard Takayawa who resides in Japan joined the team in Birmingham on 29th July as he had competitions leading up to his departure. Tevita Takayawa was already in the UK staying and training with Coach Mike Liptrot at the Kendal Judo Club.

Due to COVID 19 restrictions, adequate team preparation was a challenge. Team Fiji gratefully acknowledges the financial support and training opportunities provided by Commonwealth Sport through its Development Fund and GAPS Program, as well as DFAT's valuable contribution through the Pacific Partnership Program, which made it possible for athletes to attend PreGames training camps.

1:7 COVID PLANNING

Team Fiji required all athletes and officials to be fully vaccinated in order to be a part of the Team and they were expected to follow Covid-19 protocols. Two RAT tests were mandatory as an extra precaution and detection if a member was positive. While the UK itself did not have a pre-arrival Covid test requirement, the Organising Committee made it compulsory for each CGA to have a pre-arrival PCR Test in order to receive accreditation. The Organising Committee provided a playbook as an easy to follow, yet comprehensive guide to the mitigation measures relating to COVID-19 to ensure an optimum platform to give every participant the best opportunity to REACH THE START LINE.

1:8 UNIFORMS

Nike, the official team supplier and sponsor, provided polo shirts, round neck t-shirts, tracksuits, casual shorts/skirts, rain jackets, hoodies, caps, gym shorts, runners, slides, socks, trolley bags, duffle bags and backpacks whilst the march out uniform sulu/skirt, bula shirt and sandals were purchased locally. Team members also received Games pins, Pure Fiji travel pack, N95 masks (3 per day) and a mask lanyard. Nike also provided on-field uniforms for Rugby, Lawn Bowls, Table Tennis and Squash. The Rugby uniforms came complete with training kits. It was unfortunate that some uniforms were short supplied and were delivered during the Games in Birmingham.

2. AT THE GAMES

2.1 ARRIVAL IN BIRMINGHAM

Team Fiji's advance party of Chef de Mission Sale Sorovaki, Justine Mannan and Ritesh Ratiram flew to the UK on 18 July, 2022.

The Organising Committee (OC) had set up a huge Welcome Centre which was the first stop for all teams before they were dispersed into their respective Games Villages. A COVID-19 PCR test was the first station where everyone was tested before they could proceed to the accreditation stations. The Delegation Registration Meeting was held which covered Accommodation, Arrivals and Departures and Accreditation. Team Fiji was provided with 8 CGA Assistants in Birmingham to help in the day to day activities across the three Games Villages. Team Fiji was also privileged to have London based Ms Francis Waqavonovono, a staff member at the Fijian High Commission in London, as the Team Attaché. This was great with her knowledge of Birmingham and being familiar with the transportation system.



2.2 FLAG RAISING CEREMONY

The flag raising ceremony was conducted at The University of Warwick. Team Fiji was welcomed to the 2022 Commonwealth Games by the Mayor, Councillor Richard Edgington at the flag ceremony along with Samoa and Norfolk. The Mayor was presented with a Fijian war club. The team witnessed a spectacular show put on by the OC which showcased what Birmingham, as a city, had to offer.

2.3 FIJIAN COMMUNITY & CULTURAL PROGRAM

An invitation to a dinner was organised by members of the Fijian Community. A donation was received and distributed amongst the 67 athletes. An invitation to Aldershot for a Fiji celebration was welcomed by Team Fiji members who had completed their events. This was a chance to meet up with relatives, taste some Fijian food and an opportunity to visit another part of the UK. Appreciation was extended to Fijian nationals in the British Armed Forces.

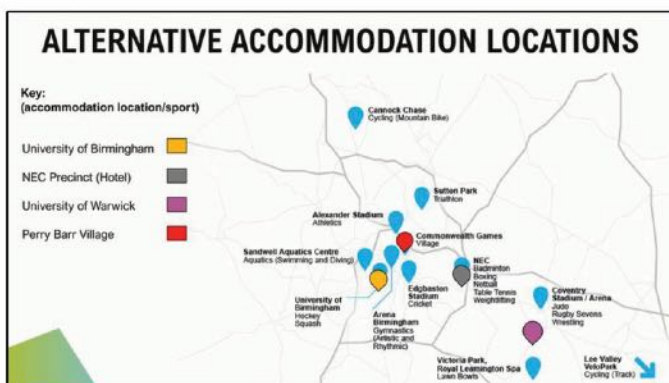

The Hilton Birmingham Metropal (NEC) was in the centre of the three Games Villages where Chef de Mission Sale Sorovaki, Administrator Justine, Press Attache Ritesh, Team Doctor Qovu and Team Physio Sarote were also housed. A medical space was set up in the main hall of the hotel where Fiji had its own booth complete with an examination table and physio bed. The Team Fiji office was located in the third wing and was fully functional with all office supplies.

Food – Food and dining room facilities were excellent with rooms clean and spacious. There were also late night dining areas to cater to athletes who finished late from competing and for those who could not sleep based on time difference who felt hungry.

Competition Venues – The venues were superb, being able to meet the safety standards required by all participants and spectators alike.

Training Schedules – Were well looked after by team managers with training sessions well run by the organizers, that were in close proximity to the village.

Laundry – the process of doing laundry was fairly easy to follow with everyone taking it upon themselves to dry in their rooms and on their balconies if needed.

Physio Clinics – Were set up at the Team Fiji Office, that was clean and spacious with good ventilation. The location was also central and easy to access. The medical room set up at the Games village was well done and convenient for the team.

Transport – Was one of the biggest problems across all three Games Villages as there was miscommunication between shuttle drivers and the transport team. Shuttle times were not as scheduled and very irregular. All sports with competition venues outside the Games Village complexes were provided with transport, to take athletes to their venues on time.

Section Managers Meetings – Were held at 9.00pm as most sports finished late in the day, allowing everyone to get transport back to CGB. Extremely helpful during the Games and kept all well informed. Officials were able to share updates and raise issues that were collectively resolved.

CGA Assistants – All were invaluable and provided Team Fiji with much needed professional support. They enjoyed their work so much and some even came on their days off, as one of ladies mentioned, "Just to be with the team."

Security – In and around the Games Villages was commendable.

INCIDENTS/REMARKS

There was an incident with an athlete who was not feeling well and isolated himself only coming out for meals. Section Manager was very concerned and the athlete was taken to see a doctor. A team bonding session with all sports was organised and was managed, facilitated and coordinated by CEO/Sports Chaplain emphasising on athlete wellbeing.

Section Managers and Coaches who had travelled to previous Games were well equipped with how to organise teams during the day with regards to transport, meals, competition and training.

4. MEDICAL – PHYSIOTHERAPISTS SAROTE NAKAORA & AMIT SAMUEL

Preparation – There were 8 physio clinics held in Fiji during the 5 weeks before travel.

Physio Clinics – Quite a task juggling 3 villages at once.



4.1 MEDICAL – TEAM DOCTOR DR. JOSIA QOVU

Preparation – The main issue for the medical team during the preparation stage was COVID-19. All athletes were well examined and passed the Doctor's examination with the need to be vaccinated at least twice and have COVID-19 status known well before the Games. Rapid antigen tests were done on all travelling members 2 weeks before departure.

Pre-Games Training Camps – Minimal medical team involvement was required from sports except for rugby which had asked for complete medical check-ups on players and officials due to requirements from World Rugby given the high intensity sport.

4.2 COVID-19 – Covid Liaison Officer (CLO), Wayne O'Connor

Information dissemination to Team Fiji Post/Pre and During Games time

Of concern team members registering positive results with Rugby Women having five positive cases prior to departure from Fiji. Team management sought "Exemption to Travel" from the Organizing Committee, that was approved with travel to the UK delayed slightly. Team Fiji also registered four positive cases from the mandatory PCR Tests and again necessary Exemptions were sought resulting in sufficient time and clearance prior to departure. Upon arrival at the Welcome Centre in the UK everyone was again tested with one person testing positive who then spent three days in isolation.

Daily Chef's meetings were held where much was expressed about the lack of communication regarding positive COVID cases. CGAs continued to monitor their own isolation cases, with referrals to the authority if necessary.

On the night of the Closing Ceremony, two more Team Fiji members received advice of having tested positive following mandatory PCR tests for travel. They were immediately withdrawn and sent to the Village to isolate. They therefore missed their departure flight the next morning and were reticketed to travel a few days later, subject to negative test results.

Upon return to Nadi RAT Tests were conducted for the whole Team. This was done at the Tanoa International where the Team spent the night. One positive COVID case resulted with the athlete immediately isolated. A taxi was provided for the transfer of athlete and COVID Officer to Suva the next day whilst the rest returned by coach.

A new round of scholarships for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games became available of which nominations were invited from Olympic Sports. It was pleasing to receive 16 applications from 6 National Federations of which six athletes were selected for the period 2022-2024.

Athletes utilised scholarship funds towards local living and training expenses and preparations towards participation at the Birmingham Commonwealth Games for all except for Sophia as there was no Sailing on the program. Banuve Tabakucoro was selected and participated in the World Athletics Championships in Oregon, USA prior to the Commonwealth Games. Hansel McCaig participated in the FINA Short Course Championships in Melbourne, Australia in December. Weightlifter Taniela Rainibogi participated in the World Championships in Bogota, Peru in December. Tevita Takayawa won Gold at the Oceania Open in Tahiti in September, Bronze in the Oceania Championships in Perth, Australia in October and participated in the Tokyo Grand Slam in December. Sophia Morgan sailed in the ILCA Women's World Championships in Texas in October and the North Island Championships in NZ in November

Team Support Grant (TSG)

The Fijiana Rugby Women's Sevens Team was again successful in being granted the TSG for the new quadrennial commencing in 2022 until Paris 2024. Funding assisted the Team with preparations for the HSBC Series and participation in the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. Specialised equipment of GPS and Game Ready Systems were purchased for the team. Congratulations to the team for winning Silver in Birmingham and for improved rankings in the World Rugby Series where for 2022 they were ranked third.

Continental Athlete Support Grant

The sports of Athletics, Baseball, Boxing, Judo, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Triathlon and Weightlifting received support towards preparations for the Saipan Pacific Mini Games and the Birmingham Commonwealth Games.

International Coaching Enrichment Certificate Programme (ICECP)

Marlene Blake, Rosemary Rova and Sharon Smith Swimming Fiji coaches, successfully completed the virtual programme and received their certification. Congratulations also to Fiji Rugby coaches Tihirani Uluinakauvadra and Lemeki Savua who also attended and successfully passed.

MEMOS

Ritesh Ratiram, FASANOC Sponsorship Marketing Manager continued the MEMOS XXIV Program that commenced virtually in 2021. He attended Module 2 in Dubai and is currently completing the program that will see him graduating in 2023.

Anushil Kumar, Fiji Football Federation's Manager Marketing & National Team Manager was accepted into the MEMOS XXV program and travelled to Geneva for Module 1 in September. The program continues until September 2023.

NOC Management Initiatives

Kiliati Enterprises continued to assist with the delivery of OSEP courses and worked with FASANOC's Sports Development Officer in assisting Team Fiji and a few National Federations with advice and support. Specialised equipment was purchased during the year and discussions with HPC on the usage and hire fees and procedures were put in place.



Olympoceanica Grant

Following on from a grant received to assist with FASANOC's new Headquarters to be built in Toorak, tenders were received for a design concept. The next phase is being finalised for a competition for selected architects to submit designs.

Women In Sport High Performance Pathway (WISH)

Veniana Ravesi, a member of Fiji Judo Association, was selected to attend the program, a joint initiative between Olympic Solidarity and a number of International Federations, bringing together high-performance coaches from around the world and providing a unique opportunity and environment for learning that will support women high-performance coaches to further develop their coaching skills in a high-performance domain; leadership behaviours; and confidence to progress their career path. Virtual modules were held with a face to face session held 23-28 October at the University of Hertfordshire in the UK. The program continues until the end of February 2023.

National Activities Program:

Team Fiji – Funding assisted with team participation expenses to the 2022 Pacific Mini Games in Saipan and the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games that included insurance, transport to and from Nadi Airport and partial payment of a charter flight to and from Saipan. **OSEP Program / Sports Education Commission** – Delivery of OSEP Programs February – April (see Sports Education Commission report for details on programs held).

This was a 9 month programme of which all sessions were done virtually on-line. His project was on "World Rugby's Trans Gender Policy: Safe, Fair & Inclusive?". He was also the winner of the Olympic Solidarity Scholarships Competition for completion of the Course in the 2021-2022 academic year at the University.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

International Olympic Committee – Several webinars were held during the year with staff joining in particularly in the areas of social media sessions.

IOC Olympic Movement Unit on the Prevention of the Manipulation (PMC) of Sport Competitions – Webinars continued to be held that were attended by the President and staff. Vice President Prem Narayan attended an IOC organised workshop in Auckland.

Oceania National Olympic Committees (ONOC), Secretaries General Workshops, 8-12 March – The President, CEO, Sports Development Manager and Senior Team Fiji Administrator attended the series of workshops in Guam. A two-day trip to Saipan to visit Pacific Mini Games villages and sports venues was also included.

'Terre de Jeux 2024', 06 April – On the occasion of the International Day of Sport for Development and Peace, Paris 2024 and the Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs organised a 24-hour worldwide sports relay, mobilizing the world of sport through the embassies and overseas territories. The French Embassy in Suva organised the 'first leg' of the Relay that commenced in Suva with a run/walk around Albert Park, down Queen Elizabeth Drive, to the junction of Ratu Sukuna Road and return to the start area. A reception was then held at the GPH where certificates of participation and refreshments were served. FASANOC Life Member Dr Robin Mitchell was one of the Guest Speakers.

Nakasi High School – Following on from the Terra de Jeux 2024, FASANOC collaborated with the French Embassy in Suva together with sponsors Vodafone and Tower Insurance who donated sporting items to Nakasi High School in November where the school grounds were renamed as 'Miriama Tusorisorori Chambault Field' after Fiji's first Olympian female athlete who is now based in France.

ONOC Annual Assembly – held in Nadi 28 April – 05 May attended by President, Vice Presidents Vanessa Kilner and Jerome Kado and Sports Development Manager. IOC President Bach attended and all delegates travelled after the Assembly to Suva to witness the official opening of the new ONOC Headquarters.

Commonwealth Sport – A grant of £20,000 greatly assisted Team Fiji preparation for Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. Sports that benefitted were: Athletics including Para, Bowls, Boxing, Swimming, Table Tennis and Para, Triathlon, Weightlifting and Rugby Sevens. Funding supported transportation allowances for athletes to and from training, venue hire, coaches' allowances and local training camps.

Birmingham 2022 Queen's Baton Relay – Hosted the QBR in Fiji 13-15 February. Activities included HE President of Fiji receiving the Baton at State House, a reception at the British High Commissioner's residence, visits to most sporting venues of sports Fiji participated in at Birmingham, taking the baton out on the reef at Sigatoka visiting a coral planting program and a relay around 'Koroipita', a model self-sustaining community on the outskirts of Lautoka.

Commonwealth Sport (CS), – President and Vice President Prem Narayan attended the Annual Assembly held in Birmingham on 26 July during the Commonwealth Games. At this meeting the 2023 CYG was confirmed to be held in Trinidad & Tobago.

ANOC, 18-21 October, Seoul – The General Assembly was held in Korea and attended by the President. ANOC conducted several on-line workshops and webinars that FASANOC was fortunate to be one of 115 NOC's from 4 Continental Associations to have participated and learnt from with the aim to equip NOCs with the knowledge and tools to enhance their social media performances. Each workshop featured different guests from different NOC's that spoke on how effective certain Social Media platforms have helped their NOCs share knowledge, build cooperation and seek advice on different challenges faced by certain NOCs.

Pacific Games Council, 19 June – General Assembly held in Saipan during the Pacific Mini Games was attended by the President. Pacific Games 17-19 November: Ajay Ballu, Team Fiji Chef de Mission to the Solomon Islands 2023 Pacific Games, and Senior Team Fiji Administrator Jane Wong-Niubalavu attended the CdM meeting in Honiara.

DFAT and Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) – FASANOC and Team Fiji acknowledges the significant assistance received through the PacificAus Sport Program and the collaboration with the AOC. Athletics, Squash, Table Tennis and Triathlon received funding for training camps in Australia immediately prior to departing to the Birmingham Commonwealth Games. The Australian High Commission and Immigration Department in Fiji are acknowledged for the support in assisting with the necessary visas for these camps.

FINANCE

2022 had been a busy financial year. Not only did we recover from the Covid pandemic, Team Fiji went to two Games which meant that cash management was of top priority. Below is a summary on the financial performance for the year ended 31st December, 2022:

Revenue

Overall revenue for the period had increased in comparison to last year due to grant funding received from Partners. FASANOC was fortunate that the pandemic did not have any impact on IOC funding, hence we were able to allocate certain funds to National Federations for preparation in 2022. Further, we are grateful that the Commonwealth Games Federation provided team preparation and participation funds to ease the financial burden of Team Fiji. To add on, Suva Apartments realised a good increase in accommodation sales as Fiji borders opened up. Moreover, with no restrictions in place, FASANOC was able to have events and utilise its income on outreach programs.



Expenses

While FASANOC remains in a good financial position, it is mindful of its commitment towards financing the construction of the new Fiji Olympic House, as well as Team Fiji's participation at another two Games in 2023.

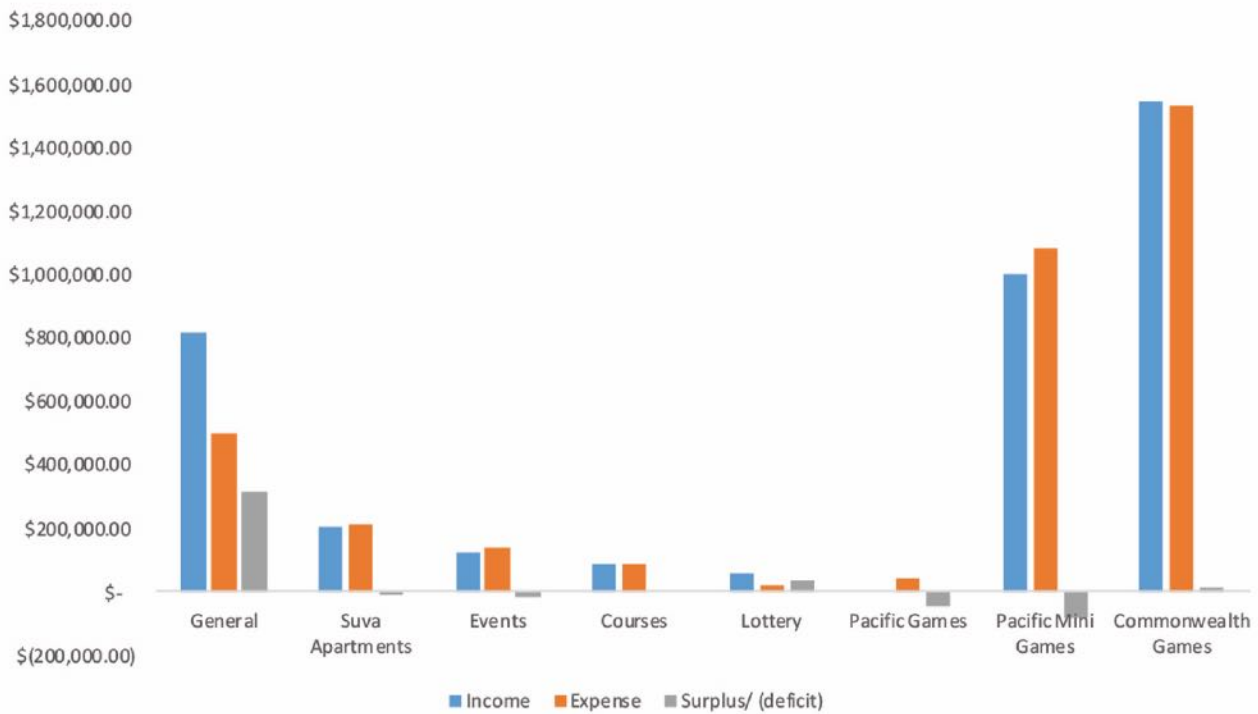

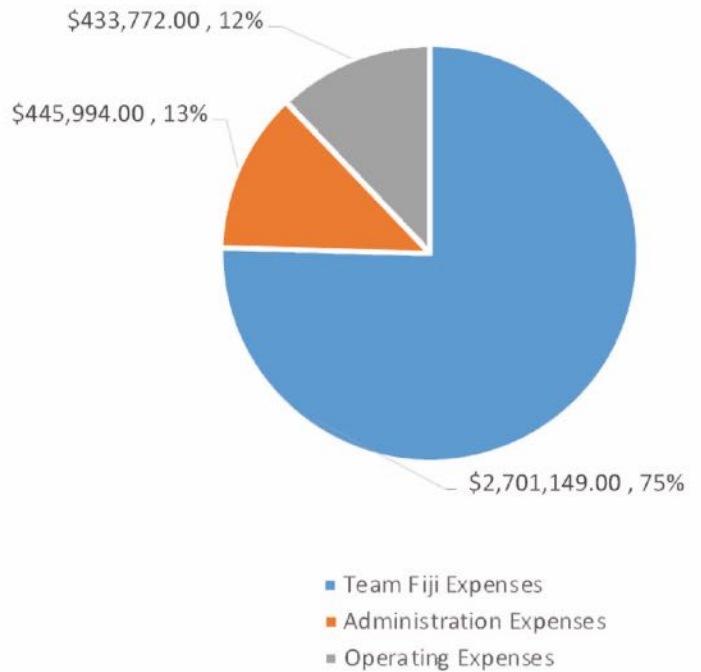
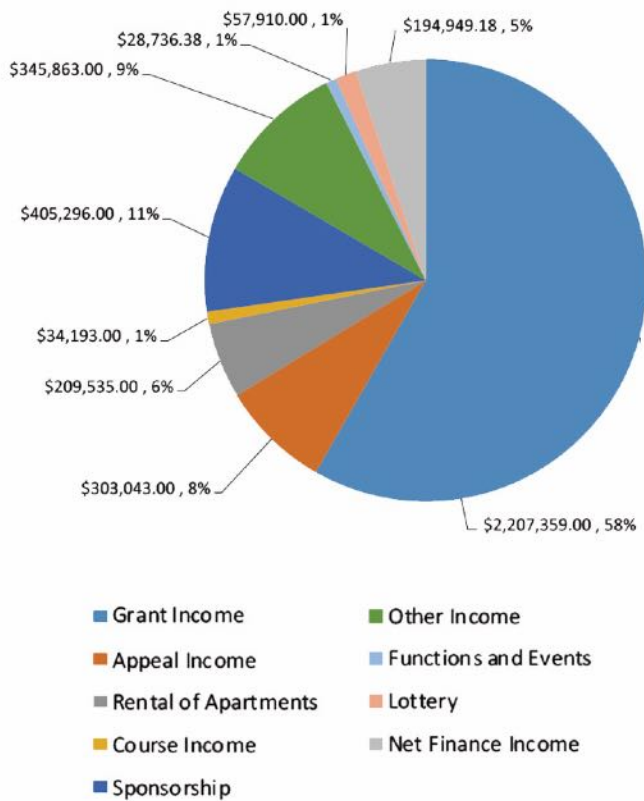

FIJI SPORTS HALL OF FAME & FIJI OLYMPIC ORDER



The 2022 Fiji Sports Hall of Fame and Fiji Olympic Order Induction Dinner was held at the Grand Pacific hotel on Friday 2nd December 2022. Mr Ram Bajekl, Chairman and former CEO & Managing Director of FMF Foods Ltd for twelve years, was the Chief Guest. He shared not only his work experience in the private sector for over 30 years but how sports greatly influenced his life. FASANOC sincerely thanks the three independent members of the judging panel, Ms Fantasha Lockington, Mr Maikeli Seru and Mr Satish Narayan for their services.

With the inclusion of this year's recipients, FASANOC has now inducted 45 "all time Fiji sporting greats" plus the famous 2016 Rio Olympic Games Gold Medal Team Fiji Rugby Sevens Team into the Fiji Sports Hall of Fame and conferred 26 Fiji Olympic Orders to very worthy and long-time sporting administrators and officials.

2022 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE – SALOME TABUATALEI (Athletics)



Salome is a source of inspiration not only to the younger athletes but to the women of Fiji. She is an excellent role model athlete who has achieved success through her determination and perseverance. Salome currently holds the Fiji Records for the Women's 1,500m, 3,000m, 5,000m, 10,000m and Half Marathon all of which were set in the 1990s.

As an active athlete, Salome was a member of the Labasa Athletics Association and represented Fiji in Athletics at a regional level for over 13 years from 1900–2003 with the following notable achievements:

- 1990 Oceania Athletics Championships, Suva: 6th 3000m
- 1993 Pacific Mini Games, Vanuatu: Silver 1500m and 3000m
- 1994 Oceania Athletic Championships, Auckland, NZ: Bronze 1500m, Silver 5000m
- 1995 South Pacific Games, Tahiti: Silver 1500m, 3000m and Gold 4x100m Relay
- 1996 Oceania Athletics Championships, Townsville, Australia: Gold 1500m and 5000m
- 1997 South Pacific Min Games, American Samoa: Gold 1500m, 3000m, 10000m
- 1998 Oceania Athletics Championships, Tonga: Gold 800m and 1500m, Silver 5000m
- 1999 South Pacific Games, Guam: Gold 1500m and 10000m, Silver 5000m
- 2000 Oceania Athletics Championships, Adelaide, Australia: 7th 1500m
- 2001 South Pacific Mini Games, Norfolk Island: Gold Half Marathon, Silver 5000m and 10000m 2003 – South Pacific Games, Fiji: Gold Half Marathon

FIJI OLYMPIC ORDER RECIPIENT – PATRICK BOWER

Patrick, known to many hundreds of students he has taught both in the classroom and on the athletics track as Master Bower, has been involved in sports for most of his life. Many may not know that Patrick was a champion athlete and hockey player in his school days and so understands what it takes to become an athlete both on and off the field.

He is a certified Level 2 Athletics Coach for Track and Field; Life Saving Instructor of the Royal Lifesaving Society, Melbourne and has been an organizer of various coaching clinics for community schools and teachers in Athletics, Swimming and Lifesaving. He is also a well respected Counsellor providing mentoring, counselling and character building services to athletes and coaches.

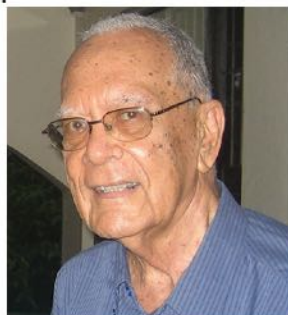
SPORTING TRIBUTES

FASANOC pays tribute to the following sports people and colleagues who passed away in 2022:

John May – FASANOC Senior Vice President, 1996–2001, Chairman HPC during his tenure; Chef de Mission Team Fiji to 1998 Commonwealth Games, Kuala Lumpur, 1999 South Pacific Games, Guam and 2000 Olympic Games, Sydney. FASANOC Trustee 2015–2022; FASANOC 60th Anniversary recipient; National Representative in Hockey and former President of Fiji Hockey Association.



Charles Walker, FASANOC Trustee – Served as one of two FASANOC Trustees for many years. He was a keen golfer in his day.



Satyanand – represented Fiji in Cricket, Tennis and Football from the 1950s to the 1970s. He also played Hockey at district level and Lawn Bowls. In his nineties he also actively played bridge. He was in the Fiji Cricket Team captained by the Late President, Ratu Sir Kamisese Mara, when they beat the West Indies by 12–runs in a one-day international in Suva in 1956. During his hockey playing days in the 1950s Satyanand played full-back for Namoli Sports Club and then in Suva played for the Shamrock team for 20 years. In football he played full-back for Natabua High School in Lautoka before moving to Suva where he played from 1951–1961 when Suva won the IDC five times.



He was in the winning Suva Team when they won the King Irvin Cup in 1954 and the McIlwain and Lady Garvey Cup in 1960. He made his international debut against New Zealand in 1952. After playing Football he coached both the Lautoka and Suva Teams. As coach of Lautoka they beat Suva for the Pala Cup 7–0. He represented Fiji in Tennis at five South Pacific Games including the inaugural Games in Suva in 1963 where he played in the doubles event winning Gold – the only Gold Medal that Fiji Tennis has won at any Pacific Games. He played and won medals in the following SPG 1966 New Caledonia, 1969 Papua New Guinea, 1971 Tahiti and 1975 Guam. He was President of the Lawn Tennis Association for five years in the 1970s and was General Manager (now known as Chef De Mission) of the Fiji Team to the South Pacific Games in 1983 in Samoa.

George Koi – Football: – A disciplined and dedicated football legend who helped Fiji beat Australia 1–0 in 1977. He played for Rewa when they won the Inter District Tournament in 1972. He was active within the FFA and EFFRA.



Emasi Koro Bacardi – Football: Another football legend and talented midfielder of Nadi who was in a class of his own during his peak days and known as a cool, skilful and great visionary player. He represented the Nadi Airport Soccer Club as soon as he left school in 1975, played for Nadi in 1976 and was in the first Nadi Team that won the National league in 1978, 1980–1983 and 1985. He represented Fiji on many occasions in the 80s with his career highlight captaining Fiji against Mexico in 1980 at the National Stadium. He was described as a gentle giant on and off the field, well liked and respected by his peers and teammates at every level he played in. He was part of the EFFRA.



Taito Bula – Football: Former national and Ba striker who sadly passed away at the age of 54. He made his debut for Ba in 1989 after coming in as a substitute in a 5–0 drubbing at the hands of Nadroga during a National Football League match. He was a member of the national football team that created history by winning its first South Pacific Games Gold medal in Lae, Papua New Guinea.

He scored the winning goal against New Caledonia in the semi-final.



Mosese Taga – Rugby: Former Fiji Rugby 15s Captain played as a prop, and made his Fiji debut during the 1987 Rugby World Cup against New Zealand in Christchurch. The former Suva captain played his last international against Australia in Sydney on September 18, 1998.



Vilikesa Mocolutu – Rugby: Played for Fiji in 1964 a year after leaving school. He had a lapse of 10 years before reappearing in 1974 when he captained the Fiji rugby team when they lost to the All Blacks by one point at the old Buckhurst Park. He also skippered the team on their tour of NZ in the same year. He later became coach of the Fiji rugby team in the 1980s and also coached the USP Rugby Club. Vili also played Cricket for the QVSOB team in the 1980s.



Joeli Vidiri – Athletics/Rugby: Represented his school in Athletics in 100m and 200m and was later selected and represented Fiji at the South Pacific Mini Games in 1991.

He also played Rugby for QVS in the U15, U16, U17 & U19 Grades where they won the Deans Trophy. He was a member of the Mosi & Nawaka Clubs, Nadi Rugby First XV Rep; Fiji 7's Rep – 1994, Fiji 15's Rep 1995 where he played 7 tests for Fiji. and Counties Manukau, NZ Rep. As a member of the Auckland Blues Super Rugby Joeli was the Top Try Scorer in his first season in 1996. He went on to be an All Black in 1998 and played two tests for New Zealand and was the first iTaukei to wear the All Blacks jersey.

He made 71 appearances for Counties scoring 56 tries and played 62 games for the Blues scoring 43 tries. He won two Super Rugby titles with the Blues in 1996-1997 and was a 1998 Commonwealth Games Gold medallist with the All Blacks in Kuala Lumpur.



John Lal – Football. The highlight of his career was in 1951 when he was selected for the Suva team at the age of 17. He continued his active involvement as a player for about 15 years in both the Suva and Fiji national teams, and captained the Suva Team that won the 1960 IDC. In 1961 he was the vice-captain of the Fiji team that toured New South Wales. He became a highly successful coach of district and national teams that included coaching the Fiji National team that defeated the Australian national team at Suva's Buckhurst Park and a few days later drew with the Chinese Taipei national team in 1977.



Jacque Williams – Rugby League: Stand-out Section Manager of the Women's Rugby League team in its inaugural appearance at the 2019 Pacific Games held in Apia, Samoa where they won the Team's first Gold Medal. Her appointment as Manager of the Kaiviti Silktails was a testament to her professional, efficient management and administrative skills.



Phil Wilkins – Swimming, Represented Fiji at the 1966 South Pacific Game in Noumea winning 3 Bronze medals in the 100m, 200m and 400m Freestyle and 2 Silvers in the 4x100m Freestyle and 4x100m Medley Relays. At the 1969 South Pacific Games in PNG he won Silver in the 100m Freestyle, Bronze in the 200m Freestyle and 2 Bronze medals in the 4x100m Freestyle and 4x100m Medley Relays.

Lemeki Savua – Oceania Sports Education Programme (OSEP) Master Educator, Fiji Rugby Regional Development Officer North, World Rugby accredited trainer and former school teacher. Lemeki has been responsible for preparing Team Fiji Managers and Coaches prepare for Games involving Team Fiji through the OSEP Managers Courses and Strength and Conditioning (S&C) Courses for many years.

We are aware of informal clubs including at FNU that were working with the Badminton Oceania Regional Development Officer, Kum On Tarawa, however these clubs are yet to formally register with Badminton Fiji.

Major Achievements for the Year:

1. Completed the National Championship at Junior and Open levels in February/March.
2. Commenced weekly Para badminton sessions from the second half of the year at the Vodafone arena
3. Two players (Jared Chung and Sristi Nadan) competed at the Victor Oceania Championships in February 2022
4. One player (Chang Ho Kim) competed at the Sydney International in October 2022
5. The Badminton Fiji Local Development Officers (LDOs) Josefa Matasau (Central Division) and Ulaia Ravugatini (Western Division) worked closely with the FNSC sports development team and Badminton Oceania's Regional Development Officer (RDO) over the year and we would like to acknowledge the support shown to us by FNSC. Through this support we were able to reach out to the people who have yet to experience Badminton. This outreach would also not have been possible without the help of Badminton Oceania, who have played a major role in providing support through the Shuttle Time Program and their RDO, Kum On Tarawa. Using our Shuttle Time Fiji Program in 2022 alone we were able to reach out to 10,448 kids or 131% of our target. This was possible through the help of FNSC's KICS Program. Shuttle Time Fiji also trained 4 tutors (3 males), 13 Teachers (5 females) and 127 Youth Leaders (63 females) in 2022. Given a total workforce of 144 this equates to 96% of our Target.

We acknowledge with gratitude the funding and support by FNSC for our Development Officer Program. Without this, it would not be possible to achieve such a positive outreach, particularly into the rural areas.

6. Distribution of 29 cartons of Shuttle Time and Air Badminton equipment from Badminton Oceania to the

North, West and Central Divisions. This was coordinated by our Badminton Fiji LDOs, the RDO and FNSC team. We acknowledge the support of FNSC in storing and distributing the equipment and helping us take the sport to the rural areas.

One key downside to note in our development work in 2023 will be the absence of the Badminton Oceania's RDO, whose contract ended in December 2022. We acknowledge Kum On Tarawa's great work in helping roll out Shuttle Time to our people and thank Badminton Oceania for their support.

Financial Overview:

Over the course of 2022 Badminton Fiji was able to finance its operations through grants provided by the FNSC and Badminton World Federation. We also received Shuttle Time and Air Badminton equipment through Oceania Badminton, which was subsequently utilised by our LDO, BOC RDO and FNSC Sports Development team in taking and teaching the sport across Fiji.

Additional Comments/Acknowledgements:

Badminton Fiji sincerely acknowledges the FNSC for its ongoing technical support through its Sports Development team as well as the funding support through 2022, which enabled us to develop our Local Development Officers (LDOs) who were then able to play key roles in taking the sport of Badminton to a wide area of Fiji.

This year it is envisaged that our LDOs will focus on strengthening our ties more with the FNSC Sports Development Team and hopefully expose more talent across the country. We are also planning on a more inclusive approach in 2023, and for that we are also focusing on strengthening our network with the Fiji Paralympic and Special Olympic Organizations.

Identifying talent early while players are still young is key towards the success and future prospects in elite national and regional competitions. So, this year we are planning to get more schools involved in our program. We also take this opportunity to thank FASANOC, Badminton World Federation and Badminton Oceania Confederation for their ongoing assistance. Whether it be in technical development, training or grants to help us attend competitions, Badminton Fiji is ever thankful. We look forward to exciting times ahead and are hopeful of getting the same support this year.

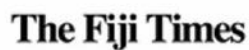
