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## SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

### Oral Questions

- 49/2025 Hon. Viam Pillay to ask the Minister for Multi-Ethnic Affairs and Sugar Industry – Can the Minister update Parliament on the extension and construction of Railway network as announced earlier.
- 50/2025 Hon. Alipate Tuicolo to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications – Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on Fiji’s National Digital Strategy.
- 51/2025 Hon. Vijay Nath to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications – Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament why despite the Government’s repeated assurances of bridging the digital divide, internet connectivity in Vanua Levu remains challenging.
- 52/2025 Hon. Lynda Tabuya to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications – Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on the short- and long-term benefits of the Memorandum of Understanding [MOU] signed recently between Fiji and the United Arab Emirates [UAE].
- 53/2025 Hon. Inia Seruiratu to ask the Minister for Environment and Climate Change – Can the Minister update Parliament on the status of Fiji’s NDC (Nationally Determined Contributions).
- 54/2025 Hon. Ratu Isikeli Tuiwailevu to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation – Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on the timeline for completing the upgrades at Nadi International Airport, to improve and enhance service quality ahead of the projected 2025 tourism growth.
- 55/2025 Hon. Alvick Maharaj to ask the Minister for iTaukei Affairs and Culture, Heritage and Arts – Can the Minister inform Parliament how *mataqali* members are being compensated now that equal distribution of lease money has been removed and *mataqali* members are getting far less compared to what they used to get under equal distribution.

Esrom Immanuel to ask the Minister for Public Works, Meteorological Services and Transport – Can the Minister update Parliament on the grant funding agreement with the International Solar Alliance (ISA) for the implementation of solar projects under the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (QUAD) Climate Initiative for healthcare facilities and solar cold storage.

Ratu Rakuita Vakalalabure to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications – Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament on how the recently approved Wind Loads Standards will improve resilience of building structures against the severe wind events in Fiji.

  - (b) what disciplinary actions have been taken against drivers found at fault, including the number of drivers surcharged and the total value of surcharges to be recovered.
