SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

Oral Questions

- 128/2025 Hon. Semi Koroilavesau to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications – In light of the changing landscape of world trade and WTO rules-based trade, can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament on what are the forward plans for Fiji in protecting its trade interests and its economy from the anticipated shocks especially in light of our vulnerability as a developing country.
- 98/2025 Hon. Virendra Lal to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation – Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on the status of Fiji ratifying the Beijing Convention, Beijing Protocol and the Montreal Convention.
- 110/2025 Hon. Virendra Lal to ask the Minister for Education – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the current policy on schools placements and the measures being undertaken to ensure families can access schools close to their residence.
- 111/2025 Hon. Sakiusa Tubuna to ask the Minister for Women, Children and Social Protection – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Fiji Women’s Economic Empowerment National Action Plan (WEENAP) (2025-2030).
- 112/2025 Hon. Joseph Nand to ask the Minister for Defence and Veteran Affairs – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the details regarding access given to the RFMF Naval Division to Malau Port in Labasa as a Forward Operating Base.
- 113/2025 Hon. Taito Rokomatu to ask the Minister for Education – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Cooperation Agreement between the United Arab Emirates Red Crescent Authority and the Republic of Fiji.
- 114/2025 Hon. Ratu Isikeli Tuiwailevu to ask the Minister for Policing – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Korean National Police Agency and the Fiji Police Force.

Penioni Ravunawa to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation – Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament how many recipients benefitted from the Pilot Tourism MSME Grant Fund announced in December 2024, and what criteria were used to determine eligibility and allocation.
