Oral Questions

- 230/2025 Hon. Premila Kumar to ask the Minister for Employment, Productivity and Workplace Relations – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the strategies that the Government has implemented to improve overall productivity in the public sector.
- 231/2025 Hon. Taito Rokomatu to ask the Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs, Civil Service and Public Enterprises – Can the Prime Minister inform Parliament on the Pacific Islands Transformation Project and how it can accelerate Trade in the Pacific Project.
- 232/2025 Hon. Hem Chand to ask the Minister for Education – Can the Minister inform Parliament how the Higher Education Commission Fiji monitors the higher education institutions to ensure that the required teaching hours for all the courses are fulfilled as prescribed in the course description.
- 233/2025 Hon. Jovesa Vocea to ask the Minister for Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Native Grant 2 (NG2) piece of land in Nadarivatu that will finally return to its rightful owners, Mataqali Nadala, Yavusa Nubu.
