

PARLIAMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF FIJI

MINUTES

of Proceedings of Parliament at Suva on Friday, Third day of October 2025

- 1. The House met at 9.30 a.m. pursuant to adjournment.
- 2. Hon. Speaker took the Chair and read the Prayer.

3. ATTENDANCE

Ratu Josaia Niudamu asked the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications Can the Deputy Prime Minister update Parliament on the work undertaken by the Ministry in alignment with the United Nations Convention Against Cybercrime.
- Hon. Faiyaz Koya asked the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance and Strategic Planning, National Development and Statistics Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament whether EFL will raise the rates at which it purchases renewable energy from independent power producers (IPP's), in order to make it viable for landowners who wish to invest in this sector.
- Hon. Ratu Isikeli Tuiwailevu asked the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Trade, Co-operatives, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Communications Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament on the key outcomes of the Pacific-ACP and Forum Trade Ministers Meeting.

- Hon. Virendra Lal asked the Minister for Health and Medical Services

 Can the Minister update Parliament on what initiatives are being undertaken to rehabilitate drug offenders who are being treated at St Giles Hospital.
- Hon. Alipate Tuicolo asked the Minister for Rural and Maritime Development and Disaster Management Can the Minister update Parliament on the 'Fiji Deepens Partnership with Saemaul Undong (SMU)' initiative.

Hon. Premila Kumar asked the Minister for Education – Can the Minister provide Parliament with a yearly breakdown of the total value of scholarship grants given to each local Higher Education Institution for 2023 and 2024.
