SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

Oral Questions

- 111/2026 Hon. Inia Seruiratu to ask the Minister for Fisheries and Forestry – Can the Minister update Parliament on the buying and exporting of Sea Cucumber (Holothurian Beche-De-Mer) following the lifting of the Seasonal Ban on 1 February 2026.
- 112/2026 Hon. Iliesa Vanawalu to ask the Minister for Employment, Productivity and Workplace Relations – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Regional Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Labour Compliance and Occupational Health and Safety between Fiji, Tonga and Kiribati.
- 113/2026 Hon. Viam Pillay to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Waterways, and Sugar Industry – Can the Minister inform Parliament as to what preventative measures the Fiji Sugar Corporation (FSC) is currently undertaking at the mills to ensure they are fully prepared for the next season.
- 114/2026 Hon. Kalaveti Ravu to ask the Minister for Public Works, Meteorological Services and Transport – Can the Minister inform Parliament on incentives to support green energy projects in Fiji given the current global increase in crude oil.

 - (b) what is the Government’s plan to improve capital expenditure execution rates.

- (a) the number of private self-funded Early Childhood Education centres, primary schools, and secondary schools established in Fiji to date; and
 - (b) what is the role of the Ministry in their establishment and monitoring.
