PARLIAMENTARY RESPONSE TO WRITTEN QUESTION NO. 180/2026

Hon. Jone Usamate to ask the Minister for Justice and Acting Attorney-General – Can the Minister update Parliament on the statistics with respect to the Fiji Independent Commission Against Corruption (FICAC) caseload for the period July 2025 to June 2026 as follows –

- (a) the total number of complaints received;**
- (b) the number of cases currently under investigation and those at the prosecution stage; and**
- (c) the number of successful convictions recorded.**

THURSDAY, 20 AUGUST 2026

- A. In response to the Honourable Member's question, the Fiji Independent Commission Against Corruption advises that, for the period 1 July 2025 to 30 June 2026: The Commission received a total of 407 complaints.
- B. The Commission dealt with 508 investigation files across its Suva, Lautoka and Labasa offices during the reporting period. As at 30 June 2026, 182 investigation files remained active, comprising 125 in Suva, 29 in Lautoka and 28 in Labasa. In addition, 141 matters were at the prosecution stage. A further 19 matters were before the courts on appeal, bringing the total number of live court matters to 160. The appeal matters are separately identified and are not included in the 141 matters at prosecution stage.
- C. The Commission recorded 18 successful convictions during the reporting period. These figures reflect the Commission's caseload and court outcomes for the relevant reporting period.
