SCHEDULE 1 — QUESTIONS

Oral Questions

- 225/2026 Hon. Premila Kumar to ask the Minister for Policing and Communications – Can the Minister inform Parliament whether Fiji has the capacity to calibrate breathalyser equipment domestically, and how often such equipment is calibrated.
- 226/2026 Hon. Jovesa Vocea to ask the Minister for Housing and Local Government – Can the Minister update Parliament on the work undertaken over the past four years to guide the orderly and sustainable growth of Fiji’s major urban centres.
- 227/2026 Hon. Joseph Nand to ask the Minister for Justice and Acting Attorney-General, and Acting Minister for Employment, Productivity and Workplace Relations – Can the Minister update Parliament on the finalisation and implementation timeframe of the reviewed National Employment Policy.
- 228/2026 Hon. Naisa Tuinaceva to ask the Minister for Information, and Environment and Climate Change – Can the Minister update Parliament on the initiatives undertaken through the National iTaukei Resource Owners Council to support iTaukei communities in climate resilience, adaptation, and prudent environmental management.
- 229/2026 Hon. Viam Pillay to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Waterways, and Sugar Industry – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the specific policy initiatives or infrastructural support being provided to assist cane growers with escalating production costs, particularly concerning farm gate fertiliser and fuel pricing.
- 230/2026 Hon. Ratu Josaia Niudamu to ask the Minister for Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the measures undertaken to strengthen the monitoring and compliance of mining and quarrying operations in Fiji.
- 231/2026 Hon. Faiyaz Koya to ask the Minister for Public Works, Meteorological Services and Transport – Can the Minister update Parliament if there are plans to upgrade the Nadi to Lautoka Highway.

- 232/2026 Hon. Taito Rokomatu to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation – Can the Deputy Prime Minister inform Parliament on what the Integrated Tourism Master Plan prepared under the ‘Na Vualiku Programme’ indicate about the future of tourism in the Northern Division over the next twenty-five years.
- 233/2026 Hon. Hem Chand to ask the Minister for Education – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Ministry’s progress in reducing drug related cases in primary and secondary schools.
- 234/2026 Hon. Sakiusa Tubuna to ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation – Can the Minister update Parliament on the current status of the feasibility study for the proposed Yasawa Island Airport.

Written Questions

- 235/2026 Hon. Inia Seruiratu to ask the Minister for Justice and Acting Attorney-General, and Acting Minister for Employment, Productivity and Workplace Relations – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the total number of cases pending before the Judiciary as at 31 July 2026, categorised by the year in which each case was registered and by case type, including civil, criminal and other categories, and provide the following breakdown –
- (a) for the Magistrates Court, by each Magistrates Court location throughout Fiji;
 - (b) for the High Court, by Suva, Lautoka and Labasa; and
 - (c) for the Court of Appeal and Supreme Court.
- 236/2026 Hon. Alipate Tuicolo to ask the Minister for Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister update Parliament on the following –
- (a) the number of seismic events recorded during the 2025-2026 financial year; and
 - (b) how investment in seismic stations, monitoring technology and specialist staff has improved Fiji’s ability to detect, analyse and respond to earthquakes and associated tsunami threats.
